Kilts for Kids Day

On Thursday 24th November it is Kilts for Kids Day. This is a special event promoted by the charity Children 1st. (Children 1st is the working name of the Royal Scottish Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Children). The charity provides help to many disadvantaged children throughout Scotland. We will continue to support its work through the Prep School annual Bring and Buy Sale. Kilts for Kids Day is an additional way to help raise funds and is a nationwide event held on the final Friday in November to tie in with St Andrew's Day.

So what will happen on the day? We ask that as many children as possible come to school with something that is/contains tartan. This obviously could be the wearing of a kilt. Or it could be a tartan headband. Or your child could bring in a teddy bear with a tartan waistcoat. Please use your imagination on how your child could utilise an example of tartan!


