


Anti-Bullying Policy

What is bullying?

- Bullying is when someone is verbally, physically or indirectly threatening or hurting another person or a group of children over and over again.
- Bullying can be:



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- Physical bitting, kicking, taking another's belongings
- Verbal name calling, insulting, making offensive remarks
- Indirect excluding by leaving people out of groups or games, gossiping about people, talking about people behind their backs, standing by and watching.
- Cyber bullying

What does the Prep School do to stop bullying?

- We have an anti-bullying ambassador committee
- Teachers have learned about what bullying is and what we should do if it happens.
- Children have learned about Anti-Bullying through house events and assemblies
- We have class rules
- We have a "Safe Space" for children to come and talk to Anti-Bullying ambassadors
- We will tell a teacher or a trusted adult if we are being bullied
- We have playground buddies and a peer support system.
- We have Class Charters and Promoting Positive Behaviour systems.
